WHAT TO KNOW

about the issues



YES ON ISSUE 1

Arkansas Farm Bureau policy supports Issue 1, which would create “The Citizens Only Voting Amendment” and provide that only a citizen of the United States meeting the qualifications of a voter may vote in an election in Arkansas.



YES ON ISSUE 2

Arkansas Farm Bureau policy supports Issue 2, which would provide that the citizens of Arkansas shall have the right to keep and bear arms. Issue 1 amends Arkansas Constitution, Article 2, § 5, to protect the right to keep and bear arms.



YES ON ISSUE 3

Arkansas Farm Bureau policy supports Issue 3 which gives local communities the ability to create economic development districts in Arkansas. Issue 3 provides Arkansas cities, counties and local partnerships the modern tools they need to bring in new jobs, attract new development, and revitalize the cities and counties in which we live and work. Issue 3 does not raise taxes. Issue 3 gives local control to communities to make their own decisions about incentivizing development and levels the playing field with surrounding states.



YES ON ISSUE 4

Arkansas Farm Bureau policy supports Issue 4. Issue 4 gives the Arkansas Natural Resource Commission the authority to issue general obligation bonds for water and wastewater needs across the state. The ANRC has been issuing these bonds since 1982; however, it requires a constitutional amendment to allow them to reauthorize borrowing authority. These bonds will primarily be used for drinking water, wastewater and agricultural irrigation projects.
